Despite enduring a pretty cranky back (must be an epidemic!), Mark Dillon won this event with no losses in a clinical exhibition of talent, preparation and equipment.

Rob Edgerton showed that more than 40 years after his first combat championship win, he still has the right stuff in taking second with only OS25FP power.

Paul Dillon just couldn't get a consistent engine run with the Comiskey Super Tigre but hung in for third.

Rod Smith, another with a bad back persevered as well as he could under the circumstances to tie with Peter Krenske for fourth position. Peter lost air time with too small a tank in his first bout and suffered streamer indigestion in his second.

Although work and family commitments, distance and sciatica prevented many of the usual suspects from joining in, all bouts were closely contested and well worth seeing with heaps of inverted chasing, all sorts of "traps" being set and of course Rob E.'s famous "jiggle" when evading.

Total damage for the day was one broken 9 X 6 prop. No wonder this 30+ year old event is still alive and well in God's own country!

# 2007 W.A. State Champs. Saturday May 26th.



The competition was flown on one of the well maintained ovals at the Lumen Christi College, Thornlie, in cool overcast conditions. The wind direction was consistently south-west with a few sharp little gusts moving through. The lowish temperatures were blamed for some of the slow starts that were experienced during the day.

Judges were Hans Bertina and Charlie Stone - Hans also acted as CD. Thanks Hans and Charlie for your efforts throughout the afternoon.

Five fliers competed for the title, including Dave

Simons from Sydney.



The same flying order was used for all three rounds beginning with Dave who was sporting a new Jatsenko Akrobat with a Retro Discovery 61 providing

the horses. Although still quite new, the Retro ran very well, powering through the breeze with little effort. Many of Dave's shapes were quite neat and super-imposed but after a wayward gust during the vertical eights in Round 3 blew the Akrobat badly off course, Dave elected to wave off the remainder of the flight.

Next up was Peter White with a Stalker .66 powered GEO XL. Despite the model's obese 68 oz, the new Stalker with its abundant power hauled it around with little fuss, using only 120 ml of fuel for each flight.

Third into the air was Phil Trueman also flying a GEO XL, this one powered with a piped PA 65 which is a well sorted out combination that gives very little trouble. Phil had tweaked the needle to better handle the breeze but was flying a little too quickly causing many of his square manouvres to be rushed and not up to his usual standard.

Up next was Steve McMurray with his Southwick Lark minus its ST 51 but now powered with an OS 35XF (XF...??) which, with the removal of tailweight and heavy motor, was turning better corners than it ever had. Steve's problems with the run-away behaviour of the motor ruined his chances of completing a reasonable scoring pattern. Despite a lack of practice, he showed that he could turn out some decent manouvres when the combination was working properly. The Lark suffered damage about a month earlier, resulting in the need for extensive repairs to the wings and U/C mounting as well as prompting the engine swap.

# Lark/OS 35 Steve McMurray

Stuart Sherlock was last out of the gate with his ominous looking black O/D Delta with an ST 46 for noseweight. Stuart has been battling motor problems and line tension issues for some time, as readers of ACLN might recall. Although the .46 now appeared to be co-operating, the line


Competition entry fee is \$5 and prizes will be awarded to the first 3 place-getters.

The Monza class is a base class: - open exhaust, spur gear drive, NO SUSPENSION, that is the problem getting traction, that is why my Lancia Ferrari 1955 had tanks on the sides, so I used that to incorporate ground effects, to hold car on the track, it is drag! but I can always get more horsepower.

A good day but a pity we are not able to test or race each month. Tethered cars are just like speed only no wing, and you don't crash!!!!...

Ten competitors made the pilgrimage travelling from all corners of Melbourne to the Brimbank Falcons CLMAC club field located in the north west of Melbourne to fly 1/2A & Vintage combat. After a sunny and calm winter's morning, the storm clouds arrived just in time for the ½ A combat final. Vintage combat scheduled for the afternoon with a dozen potential entrants had to be abandoned due to the poor weather conditions.

The morning session saw many spectacular aerial battles take place. A variety of engine & model combinations were used. Ken Maier using dieselised OS .10 FP's in his own design models was let down by a failure to restart when hot after ditching his model to replace a damaged streamer.

Ex UK combat flyers, Harry Bailey and Mathew Shears were sticking with their trusty PAW 1.5's of the TBR & CT varieties powered ½ A Russian & homebuilt designs respectively.

Tony Caselli used the FORA .09D in a ½ A Russian, however he was no match for the airspeed & manoeuvrability of the new Cyclon JAK motors in the Russian built models that Mark Ellins & newcomer Mick Lewis were using, he later changed to this set up.

One of the best bouts of the day took place between Mark Ellins & Murray Wilson. Both were off at the starting signal Mark flying the latest Russian built ½ A models with the Cyclon JAK combat diesels & Murray was using a Fora in an own built ½ A Russian. Mark was launched at the starting bell & Murray followed a few seconds later after making sure his engine was on song. Both flyers were airborne almost the full 4 minutes & flew one of the cleanest but closely fought bouts I have witnessed for quite some time. Mark emerged the eventual winner with 4 cuts to 2, the difference being a speed advantage.


The cold front came through in the early afternoon right on time as forecast bringing along with it some pretty big black clouds, rain and a gusty cold southwest wind.


