



F2B Aerobatics at the Vic State Champs 2008

Well what can you say, the weather was windy and for good measure, it was gusty. Peter White was the first to brave the conditions, and even with the skill level Peter has, he struggled to post a decent score, but under those conditions he got a fabulous 939.75.

Next was Mark Ellins who was flying pretty well in the bad conditions, and had to stop halfway through due to having stitches in his flying hand caused by an incident in F2C team race in which he was hit by a competitor's model.

Craig Hemsworth, flying his Saito 72 four stroke powered monster that handled the wind the best but it was his lack of practice that kept his score down, but it was very impressive. That was it for round one.

Doug Grinham and our Sth Aussie friend, Peter Anglberger decided it was smarter if they sat round 1 out so it was decided by Damian (the C.D.) Sammut that there will be a break to see if the wind would die off. 2hrs later the wind dropped to a little zephyr breeze. It had all the pilots scampering off to get their planes fuelled and ready to go. As luck would have it stayed like that for the rest of the day.

The 2nd round got underway with Peter White being the 1st up and flying extremely well to be the 1st flyer to score over 1000pts.

Craig Hemsworth flew his well proven "KA-10'ish" to make a big improvement with a score of 952.5.

Doug Grinham was next, flying his beautiful "Hotdog" with a Stalker 6I in the nose. He flew a rather safe pattern, but never the less scored well with a 974.25.

Next flying was Mark Ellins, but due to his injured hand he struggled but non-the less still posted a decent 950.50.

Last flyer for the round was Sth Aussie, Peter Anglberger, with a very nice Focke Wulf 190 with a nice sounding ST46 up front Peter flew a nice and steady pattern to score 814.50 for his round.

The third round was an all out affair with all competitors pulling out all the stops to take the State Champs title, with four out of five scoring over 1000pts.

The 1st to fly was Peter White who put in a flawless display of skill and experience to pull off the highest score of the comp with an 1121.50.

Next was Craig Hemsworth and he flew fantastic to grab the 2nd highest score of the comp with a well-deserved 1068.50.

Doug Grinham flew next, and put in a blinder of a round, with a 1043.75.

Mark Ellins was next and put in a fantastic flight under the circumstances [injured hand] to post a 1058.00.

Last up was Peter Anglberger putting in his best flight of day with a 100-point improvement to score 918.50.

I'd like to thank all the competitors especially the interstate boys and all the Knox crew that made this event a very enjoyable and smoothly run one. Special thanks go to Peter O'Keefe for tabulating the scores and Greg Barclay for running the score sheets back and forth all day and thanks for doing the hardest job of the day go to the judges Damian Sammut and Kim Laughton who did a sterling job.

2006 Fora F2D Engine Test

Here are some more performance curves – this time for the Ukrainian Fora F2D engine. These well-regarded engines are widely used where top performance is needed. They have proven to be long lasting and reliable. Our engine is the 2006 model, which has since been followed by the "Leder" and a new model F2D engines from this company. It is not known what performance gains have been made since the 2006 model, but my results may be of use to people using the older engines.

Unlike the Cyclon PC-6 tested earlier, the Fora resented having to turn an "oversize" propeller. This is of no practical concern to F2D flyers providing they outfit the engine with the correct propeller. Choose the wrong prop and the Fora bogs down, adding 0.3 seconds per lap or more. Our test engine thrived on a narrow-bladed Seryogin propeller, achieving lap times in the 22's for 10 without much prior running time.

The observed flight performance is backed up by our test results. The BHP curve climbs over the 0.75 BHP mark at around 29,000 RPM. Annoyingly, we were not able to conduct testing at higher RPM, as the next size down in our calibrated test props would possibly not stand up to the workload. This is a pity, as we have observed the Fora's ability to build up RPM when not loaded in level flight and it would be useful to know at what point this engine runs out of puff.

Torque levels dropped in an almost linear fashion from a measured high of 31 oz-in at 17,000 RPM to a little over 26 oz-in at peak power output at 29,000 RPM. In practical terms, this suggests a setup that pushes the engine beyond its peak when flying level and accepting the inevitable drop in speed during manoeuvres to a point where adequate torque is available to maintain stable performance.


Revised Cyclon PC-6 Curves


Readers may recall my previous report on the Cyclon PC-6 engine. At the time it was calculated that the engine's peak power was developed at a surprisingly modest 23,000 RPM. However, I did comment that there appeared to be problems with the Anderson Curves used to convert test results to BHP and toque values. Since that time I've gained access to more precise torque absorption data thanks to Gordon Cornell's "Model Engine Mechanics". As a result, I have recalculated the figures and arrived at the revised power and torque curves shown here.


Peak power nudging the 0.8BHP mark is now indicated, at a more believable 26,000 RPM. Torque remains at a healthy 30 oz-in at this level. This now suggests that it would be worth exploring the previously observed slight RPM jump around 27,000 RPM. This might be harnessed to maximise level flight airspeed. As with the 2006 Fora engine, with the performance curves indicate the likely direction to take. It seems clear that the prop best suited to the Cyclon will be significantly different to the Fora's favourite.


Experimentation with propellers will surely pay dividends for those people seeking to get those last few percent of performance potential from their engines.

The weather on the ANZAC long weekend was breezy and at times wet, but all stunt events went ahead despite dire weather forecasts.

Actually the conditions were remarkably good considering the forecasts, with most of the rain falling during after flying was finished each day.

All 3 rounds were brought forward to Friday because of the weather forecasts. All flyers chose to pass on R3 due to increased turbulence as the wind shifted to the west ahead of the first front of the weekend

Mark Ellins deservedly won the event flying very consistently and was the only flyer to improve his score in Round 2 when the wind had noticeably strengthened. John Witzke flying in his first ever 'pukka' F2B event flew nicely in round 1. Leon Baird flew well but suffered short engine runs in both rounds as did Peter Anglberger in R2, who managed to hang onto 2nd place.

Another good turn out for speed, a little down from State Champs and previous contest. Class 1 still has the most entries, with guys getting faster with changes being made.

Murray managed a really fast 2nd flight of 15.99 using a Steve Wilk [USA] prop, and some of my fuel. Harry used the same fuel but did not improve much, even with one of my 2 blades which Murray tried on his third flight but fractionally slower. Vintage [Classic] Proto is getting a few entries as well. Maybe we should change the name to Classic Proto, as the models are the "Classic" team racers.

Originally we called it Vintage as Vern Marquet was sport flying his vintage model years ago on his own on another cycle, and we suggested he come and fly with us, and we called it Vintage Proto just for fun. Since then the Classic B t/r guys have been regular competitors. It has been suggested that we have Classic and Vintage.

As this is for our club days for "fun" we can do what we want, just gets people flying which is the name of the hobby. It works down in Victoria.

Vern placed 3rd with an old model in Vintage Speed powered by an old Enya 15 plain bearing.

I got out my home built RH11 and tried a later 'bigger prop" same as my new Nova uses, which I am finding is going faster, it seemed to work on my motor as well.

The model was flying too low and needed a wing incidence adjustment, so I put it away for the day. I also flew my big FAI type model with a Nova Rossi .21 in Class 2 [5cc]. It also flew low so I could not operate the cutout, but it did its best ever time of 10.11 for 98.9% of the record so I only had 2 flights all day but I had fun helping the newer guys getting sorted out. Thanks again to my crew Vern and Ron and the time keepers on the day and Fiona for the barbecue...

Next speed day is not until June 15th at Frankston. Can we wait that long for a speed "fix"? Maybe we could finally arrange a comp at Knox so we can fly the long line classes, as at the moment we only get the opportunity to fly at Knox during the Victorian State Champs.


