The new committee has come up with some changes to how things are to be done at the club all of which will be revealed once the committee has time to discuss things in a thorough manner.

The KMAC field in the opinion of the committee is of paramount importance to the control-line fraternity as it has been the home of many competitions over many years and is an already excellently developed facility. However, the committee cannot be left to run all of the competitions themselves, so help from other clubs will be sought to fully utilize the facility.

The makeup of KMAC has changed over the years to a point that at the moment the vast majority of members are sports flyers and are not competition oriented, so sport or fun fly days seem to be more important to the committee than competitions, so KMAC is only prepared to run and host the Monty Tyrell classic stunt day as well as the Hierns Trophy which we would like to run as a Vintage competition.

The Stuntmaster, Yoemans and State championship competitions are not at this time able to be run by KMAC as we do not physically have the manpower or time, but the field will be able to be used (after consultation with the KMAC committee) for these events by other interested parties, if any are forthcoming.

Robin Hiern will be organizing some speed events to be run at the field and anyone interested in running other events can contact either Robin or John Goodge to arrange use of the field.

A reminder, that the KMAC field is for the use of KMAC members. In saying this we do not wish to put flyers off coming to KMAC so the members have decided to allow members of other clubs to use the field 4 times a year after which they will be required to join as an associate member (which includes voting rights). Also the committee has determined a much lower membership and associate member fee than was in the past in attempt to increase numbers and the use of the facilities.

GOING BACK TO BRODAK'S

Ian W. Smith

You should never try to repeat a great experience-disappointment is the result, they say. Wrong. Last year (2007) I made my first visit to the Brodak Fly-in, and it was wonderful. So good, in fact, that I planned to return this year, and did with the support and company of my wife, Colleen,

It was again a very happy experience, re-meeting old friends, great fliers, support from good buddies during competition, and kind back-up from Buzz and John Brodak and their support crew. Meeting up with old friends Bob Whitely and Randy Smith was a bonus

Our journey was a little different this year, going the long way round the World to visit family and friends, and do some sight-seeing. In the final stage we flew from Gatwick (U.K.) to Atlanta, to have time with Becky and Tom Dixon, before we all drove up to Brodak's, pulling a trailer full of planes, flight gear, and Tom's goods for sale. At the end we flew to San Diego, driving to San Francisco before flying home. We met up with - California friends, including Phyllis and Charles Mackey, and Joan and Bill Netzeband.

Last year I brought a plane with me in a big box-this year I got smart. I built an old English design (Hot Shot, Ken Marsh, 1950) that is completely take-apart, mailing it to Tom in a cardboard box. The. 15 size diesel was mailed separately, and fuel was supplied by Eric Clutton - Dr. Diesel. In spite of the great effort of my Australian friend Steve Rothwell, who made the R250 diesel (an Oliver Tiger replica) other circumstances made my flights too short to complete the pattern. The Hot Shot resides now in Florida, where a glow engine may be fitted.

At the fly-in Colleen got to know many people, and was very friendly with Big Art. Bob Whitely won, or placed in, several events, and had with him his "Hawker Hunter" variation on the Shark 45. There was a large team from Brazil, twenty-two people. One of their planes was a lovely "standard" Shark 45 in yellow, black and red. The Brazilians also had a large number of Super Tucano semi-scale stunters, built from available bits. These are fine models, finished in a range of military and other colour schemes.

Another traveler, Sergio Hernandez Ortego, brought a Uly take-apart Smoothie, with Enya 40, in a very compact box. The Smoothie is eligible for the OTS, Classic and CLPA (F2B) classes, so as a future idea for an overseas visitor

Electric power was well used. There is picture of an electric Smoothie, with batteries out to be kept cool - note the cooling vent behind the canopy. Mike Palko, modest guru of electric flight, had a beautiful electric P5 1.

The whole fly-in was CD'd by Tom Hampshire and Allen Brickhaus, to very good effect. Amongst other notables were Jack and Shirley Sheeks, with their kind welcome. Of course no meeting would be complete without

the great Urtnowski. It was good to see Karen and Windy again. Highly impressive was Windy's new Spitfire stunter, with Ro-Jett 90'power. A mighty sight and sound. And Windy won the expert CLPA event with it. Everyone should have one.

As I have said, I got great support during the flying, particularly from Richard Antoszewski and Jim Catevenis. Jim is flying his TF-OSAWKI with LA 46 to good effect and more practice will make him a threat.

There was a great fun side to the fly-in. Dan Banjock flew a Bi-Slob to great effect, lowering it slowly down in vertical hover, till it sat on its elevator, then rotated down onto its wheels, for a slow take-off. Dan and Mike Palko flew together with a Ringmaster each, with opposed (upright and inverted)flying and other maneuvers, including a Bi-Slob-type hover, with both planes only three or four feet apart. Dan also tried to sneak into the front line for appearance judging with a Jim Walker 049 Firebaby.

He got caught.

The Fly-in came to an early end on the last day, with thunder and heavy rain halfway through the last rounds. This curtailed award presentation and fond farewells, but didn't spoil the great achievement and fun of the Fly-in. This year a record 178 entrants pushed circles and flying time to the limit, with a need for a future time extension and/or final round culling to fit

things in. But don't hold back. Go next year. Get the best control-line week you can have.


