



When the Nationals are not held at the traditional early New Year time slot it tends to leave a hole in the competition calendar at that time of the year. The last couple of years have had CLAMF organising a three

day completion at their club field and they have been very successful affairs. A repeat event was considered again this year but with so many competitions already arranged in the beginning of the year that require interstate travel for those amongst us that would like to qualify for the Australian team for the 2020

World Championships, it was considered that participation interest would only be lukewarm and the competition prospect lacked any serious drive. Closer to the Australia Day weekend some South Australian modellers expressed an interest to make the journey so a low key three day competition was arranged.

The scheduled events were to be Classic FAI team Race, Navy Carrier Deck, Combined Speed and Vintage Combat. The Navy Carrier Deck did not eventuate due to the lack of entries.

With the small programme of events there was no pressure to push things along and plenty of model testing and sports flying took place taking full advantage of the pleasant weather that we experienced.

The ladies in the catering department did an excellent job of feeding the hungry and the "gourmet hamburgers with the lot" were the stand out food of choice on the Sunday.

Classic FAI team race was held on Sunday morning. Neil Baker teamed with Murray Wilson to fly his "Classic Nobby" Ray Harvey built Shadow/Nelson model. Harry Bailey piloted his Klotznorutski/Parra model with Ken Hunting as mechanic. Mark Ellins piloted his Fora powered model with Paul Stein doing the flicking. With only three teams entered and a shortage of time-keepers, it was decided to have two rounds of two up races. In his second race Neil had a nice tune on the Nelson and his slick pit stops enabled him and Murray to set the fastest time of the day and edge out Harry and Ken into second place by a margin of seven seconds.

AUSTRALIA DAY SPEED COMP-Frankston- 29-1-2019.

A good entry especially in FAI Speed with 5 entrants all getting times and no damage done. Weather was hot and a little bit of wind, overall winner was Rob Fitzgerald from SA, he has been doing a

fair amount of F2A testing lately.

Class 1 (2cc) has a good entry now that we are all on 10% fuel.

Ken Hunting had his Novarossi .12 model but fuel feed problems prevented him getting a flight. Harry Bailey has now started flying FAI with a donated used model and a new Profi motor, which is only the "Belmont not a Kingswood" not that much difference! it uses a standard rear bearing, not balls running on the shaft, it has a BRASS liner which is the same as the more expensive version now, not the Beryllium

The old liner Beryllium Copper ones stay parallel not like brass liners of old. My old Profi has had 3 pistons

fitted and the liner is still tapered and round, that's a good thing as Profi chrome is a lot harder to lap than other motors. I flew my FAI Profi in a comp for the first time in years, but I had trouble keeping up with it (old age and legs) did 13.31 even holding it up for last 3 laps. accepted. Mark Ellins starts his Profi engine for a

F2A flight.

I had to pull out of pylon but luckily had done the required 9 laps. There is a definite rise in interest in C/L Speed in Victoria lately especially

F2A, when we go to the field mid-week or the odd weekend quite a few speed models get flown, which is good to see. When I went to the comp held over Aussie day week end, on the Friday practice day it was mostly FAI models flying and being worked on talked about.

I thought I had died and gone to heaven after 40 years of trying to get speed

painted white. He has a new "Kingswood" Profi model which has been going well and he is learning to fly using the FAI yoke which is harder to use than a combined speed yoke.

At the Vic State Champs we may have 10 to 12 entries in FAI speed, as it is a qualifying round for the 2020 World Championships team. On the Saturday we are going to have trouble with time to get everything done. We have to finish F2C Team race and then following FAI speed, run combined speed, so could everyone PLEASE try and keep the flights moving along. We should also stick to the 3 minute call up rule as it is W/C qualifying and we need to get used to doing it too the rule book.

I have bought an electric starter set-up for the club, so if interstate guys don't want to bring one with them they can have use of it. Report by Robin Hiern.

The Vintage Combat contest had seven entries. Les Spaltman had travelled from the Bacchus Marsh area in Victoria and Greg Nelson had driven over from South Australia and camped at the flying field for the weekend.

C.D. for the day was Paul Stein and the event got under way shortly after the lunch break on Sunday. Using the "two losses and your out" system, Nigel, Greg and Harry departed after round three. Les Spaltman had a bye in the first round and had his second loss in round four.

With the final three left in the competition Murray flew against Ken and they had a massive overhead collision resulting in two wrecked models that landed in a tangled mess in the pilots centre circle. Murray had one cut on Ken and won the bout 105 points to Ken's 87.

In the final bout, Murray had a dismal time against Tony. He was one cut down and only gained 63 seconds airtime. Tony had full airtime + 1 cut and was the champion of the day.

GLOW PLUGS FOR STUNT.

It is important to use the correct plug and fuel for C/L stunt, due to the low compression that a proper stunt engine has to get the fast 4 stroke and 2 stroke in manoeuvres.

A typical motor has around 6.5, to 10 to one compression ratio which is very low hence the low power, IF? the comp was raised to say 14 to one you would have more power but not a switching run.

The famous FOX 35 has only 6.5 to 1.

Due to low compression therefore low heat in engine you need a "HOT" plug to keep the fire alight especially as they are generally run on the rich side.

IF? a too cold a plug is used it could flame out, so you might tend to lean in the needle. That is the wrong approach, the model will fly too fast.

I had a case a while ago when a guy had a FOX 29 that would only turn 7400 rpm and would then stop running. The needle setting was super critical, there was not enough power for the model even though it had a suitable prop on it.

He had been using 3 to 1 fuel which really is too much oil even though Fox recommend 29%. The suggested excessive amount of oil is too cover up bad machining, the liner has no taper and sometimes burrs were left when the ports were cut. Until the motor is loose they can have a tendency to momentarily seize.

His motor felt OK as it must have had plenty of running.

So first I tried 4 to 1 fuel mixture as I did not have any 3 to 1 grease!! Peak revs was 10000 with glow lead ON and dropped to 9200 when it was removed.

Then I tried my sport stunt fuel with 6% nitro, the RPM increased to 12000 with the battery connected and dropped off to 11600 when the lead was removed.

The next change I made was to remove the plug he was using which was a HOT plug of which can't mention the brand.

Now, using 4 to 1 fuel again and a "HSP" hot plug (cheap around \$3.50 each from Hobby King and others from Hong Kong) revs were then 12,200 lead on and 11,600 lead off.

On 6 % fuel it was 12300 lead on or off, and in addition, with the lead off I could wind needle out to a very rich 4 stroke and the engine kept running.

All these readings were with a Fox muffler fitted.

Another case I had was a new MOKI 51 a real stunt motor, to run in on the bench. Initially, with the gold Moki plug supplied, unless the glow lead was on it would stop instantly unless a full peak revs, which is not a good scenario.

I tried various other plugs and settled for a Fox 1.5 v idle bar, it then was fine, and then I put it in an overweight model to fly and it runs like a dream.

I also had a second hand MOKI 51 that when the leads were taken off, it would drop around 500 rpm whatever plug I tried, but in air it was OK.

Why people persist in not using around 5 % NITRO has got me baffled, it is added to aid smooth running /needle flexibility etc. 5 % is enough although if you want more power keep going to say 10 ---20 %.

The Myth about metal corrosion caused by Nitro I don't believe, I have never had corrosion even when I used 60% nitromethane fuel in speed models. All I did most times was at end of day squirt some CRC and or auto trans fluid and car oil in venturi /port, flick the engine over a few times and then leave it until used the next time.

With all my Nova Rossi engines I have only ever replaced one or two bearing in 15 years and the reason for changing them was not because of corrosion.

In fact my latest Novarossi 12 I bought 12 months ago and has only ever been run on the new 10% nitro fuel, I did find a tiny stain on the crank web. Methanol however is bad for corrosion as in soaks up water from the air and storing engines with excess methanol inside them is asking for trouble.

Another good stunt plug is Enya #3 as it has a lot of platinum content in it.

Hope this is of help to avoid some of the bad runs you see.

After a LOT of running the plug may go off and not work as well, check with magnifying glass to see if has a frosted element. If the element is frosted it's probably time that it was replaced.
